

As for me, I know that my Redeemer lives and that at the last he will stand upon the earth. After my awaking, he will raise me up; and in my body I shall see God. I myself shall see, and my eyes behold him who is my friend and not a stranger.

For none of us has life in himself, and none becomes his own master when he dies. For if we have life, we are alive in the Lord, and if we die, we die in the Lord. So, then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's possession.

The Apostles' Creed

Officiant In the assurance of eternal life given at Baptism, let us proclaim our faith and say,

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth;
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again.
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The Prayers of the People

After a brief silence for reflection, the people remain standing, as they are able for the Prayers of the People. They are invited to respond to each petition with, "Hear us, Lord."

Leader For our brother Jeff, let us pray to our Lord Jesus Christ who said, "I am

Resurrection and I am Life."

People Hear us, Lord.

Leader Lord, you consoled Martha and Mary in their distress; draw near to us who

mourn for Jeff, and dry the tears of those who weep.

People Hear us, Lord.

Leader You wept at the grave of Lazarus, your friend; comfort us in our

sorrow.

People Hear us, Lord.

Leader You raised the dead to life; give to our brother eternal life.

People Hear us, Lord.

Leader You promised paradise to the thief who repented; bring our brother to the

joys of heaven.

People Hear us, Lord.

Leader Comfort us in our sorrows at the death of our brother; let our faith be our

consolation, and eternal life our hope.

People Hear us, Lord.

Silence may be kept.

The Officiant concludes with the following prayer.

Father of all, we pray to you for Jeff, and all those whom we love but see no longer. Grant to them eternal rest. Let light perpetual shine upon them. May his soul and the souls of all the departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. **Amen.**

THE COMMENDATION

The people remain standing, as they are able.

Officiant Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,

People where sorrow and pain are no more,

neither sighing, but life everlasting.

Officiant You only are immortal, the creator and maker of humankind; and we are

mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return. For so did you ordain when you created me, saying, "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." All of us go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our

song; Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

People Give rest, O Christ, to your servant with your saints,

where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting.

The Officiant then says

Into your hands, O merciful Savior, we commend your servant Jeff. Acknowledge we humbly beseech you, a sheep of your own fold, a lamb of your own flock, a sinner of your own redeeming. Receive him, into the arms of your mercy, into the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light. **Amen.**

The Dismissal

The Priest dismisses the people and the people respond:

People Thanks be to God. Alleluia! Alleluia!
